Maximum User Weight



1.0 Intended Use

The A-Series Rollator is a lightweight, aluminium rollator designed to provide support and assistance to those unable to, or who lack the confidence to, walk without some level of guidance. This rollator is intended for indoor and outdoor use.

2.0 Safety Precautions

Do not exceed the maximum user weight 21st (135kg).

Ensure the rollator is locked in the open position before use.

Only use as a walking aid in the forward direction.

Do not use on stairs, escalators or steep hills with gradients greater than 1 in 8.

Ensure both brakes are locked before using the seat and that the backrest is fitted.

Do not move the rollator when the seat is occupied.

Do not sit on the seat when the rollator is on an incline.

Do not hang items from the handles as this may affect the stability of the rollator.

3.0 Unpacking

Remove packaging and check all parts carefully before assembling, Rollator main frame, Handles x 2 and Backrest. Do not assemble if parts are damaged.

4.0 Assembly

Unfold the Rollator:

 Push down on the black bar under the bag until the cross bars are horizontal and the wheels are fully extended.

Insert the handles:

- Slot the handle tube inside the main frame.
- Adjust the height such that the handles are in line with your wrists when you stand upright with your arms relaxed by your sides.
- Align the holes in the tubes and insert the hand wheel, figure 2.

Check the hand wheel is on the outside of the frame.

• Tighten the hand wheel to secure.

Ensure both handles are set to the same height. Check the brake cable is attached:

• Clip the brake cable onto the main rollator frame, figure 3.

Attach the backrest:

- Press and hold the black button on the backrest housing.
- Slide the backrest tube into the housing slot, figure 4.
- Release the button to secure.

5.0 Use

To operate the brakes:

- Squeeze the brake lever up to apply the brakes.
- Let go of the lever to release the brakes.

To lock the brakes:

Push the brake lever down until it clicks in position.

To unlock the brakes:

 Pull the brake lever up. An audible click will be heard as the brake is released.

To fold the rollator:

- Pull the backrest towards the handle.
- Lift the seat up.
- Pull the black cord up to draw the wheels together.







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6.0 Cleaning

Ensure all dirt and debris is removed from around the wheels, axle and brakes.

Clean regularly using a general purpose, neutral detergent and warm water.

Please check the suitability of the cleaning products prior to use. Do not use abrasive cleaners or cloths as these could permanently damage the surface and invalidate any warranty.

7.0 Maintenance

Check all fasteners (screws, nuts, bolts etc.) are correctly located and securely fitted.

Check the wheels can rotate freely.

Ensure the brakes are functioning correctly. When squeezed or locked the two rear wheels should not be able to rotate.

Check for general wear or damage. Any suspected faults or damage should immediately be reported to the supplier and the product taken out of use.

8.0 Product Disposal & Waste

Product should be thoroughly cleaned prior to disposal.

Product is manufactured from metal and plastic and can be disposed of through Local Authority Household Waste and Recycling Centres or through local Trade Waste Collectors.

9.0 Product Guarantee
